KUCHING: In the spirit of Ramadan, UCSI University Sarawak Campus reaffirmed its commitment to community service through a Ramadan bubur lambuk giveaway.

Held on March 22, the initiative provided bubur lambuk – a traditional iftar meal – to the villagers of Kampung Tabuan Melayu here.
